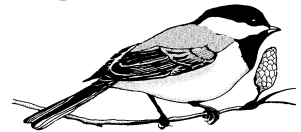

This list is based on records of bird sightings for the 288 species reported in the Sullivan County area. Of these, 41 are accidentals. 135 species breed regularly, and 11 more have been known to breed at least once.

Abundance codes refer to frequency as compared with others in that group.
